

A Prayer for Protection in Hurricane Season





WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Calling Priests Father

Question:

Why do Catholics call priests Father?

Answer

One of the common objections evangelical Christians have to Catholics is our practice of calling priests by the title Father. They will often cite a passage in Matthew's Gospel in which Jesus tells his followers: "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven" (23:19). It seems pretty straightforward, but when we put this verse in context, we see that Jesus is speaking out against religious leaders who had forgotten what their proper role was and who were bad examples through their own hypocrisy and elitist attitudes.

In other Gospels, we find Jesus himself using the title father for different characters, such as in the Parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man (Luke 16:19-31)) and the Parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). If we put the verse from Matthew into the full scope of Jesus' teachings, he isn't saying that we can't use words like "father," "rabbi," or "master." Rather, he is telling us that we should be mindful of the full meaning of those titles and not to

To call a priest "Father" is more than a sign of respect for the office of the priesthood. It goes all the way back to the way St. Paul understood his own work as a missionary and evangelizer. Paul wrote, "I am writing you in this way not to shame you but to admonish you as my beloved children ... It was I who begot you in Christ Jesus through my preaching of the Gospel. I beg you, then, be imitators of me. This is why I have sent you Timothy, my beloved and faithful son in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 4:14-17).

Yes, we have God alone as our heavenly Father, but there are also those here with us who nurture and nourish our faith through their teaching and care. This is why the title of Father has been applied to the church's pastors in different ways since the earliest days of the Church, including monks and nuns using the title "abbot" and "abbess" (from abba) for their spiritual leaders and Christians around the world recognizing the "Holy Father" or "pope" (from papa) as the head of the family that is the Church. The title Father is a reminder that priests have a special responsibility to care for, protect, feed, listen to, and nourish those who have been entrusted to them, all after the example of our Father in heaven who never ceases to give us what we truly need.

Sunday, June 28: 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Monday, June 29: Sts. Peter and Paul, Apostles: Peter and Paul are often spoken of as the two men most responsible for spreading the Christian message in the days of the early church. Legend has it that they were executed on the same day under the command of Emperor Nero and buried in Rome. (Historical accounts dispute this). Since he was a Roman citizen, Paul was beheaded while Peter was crucified upside down because he said he was not worthy to die in the same manner as Christ. As early as 258 AD there is evidence of an already-lengthy tradition that the feast day of both saints were celebrated on the same day. In a sermon in the year 395, St. Augustine of Hippo said of Peter and Paul, Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one; and even though they suffered on different days, they were as one. Peter went first, and Paul followed. And so we celebrate this day made holy for us by the apostles' blood. Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith.

Tuesday, June 30: The First Martyrs of the Holy Roman Church: These "proto-martyrs" of Rome were the first Christians persecuted by the Emperor Nero in the year 64, before the martyrdom of Saints Peter and Paul. Nero was widely believed to have caused the fire that burned down much of Rome in the same year. He blamed the fire on the Christians and put them to death, many by crucifixion, some were fed to the wild animals, others were tied to posts and lit up as human torches. These martyrs were called the "Disciples of the Apostles" and their firmness in the face of death was a powerful testimony that led to many conversions in the early Roman Church.

Wednesday, July 1: St. Junípero Serra, Priest: Fr. Serra was born in Spain in 1713 and at 16 entered the Franciscan order. He was expected to spend his life in

Spain as a teacher of theology, but at the age of 37, and in spite of poor health, he volunteered to become a missionary in the New World. He worked first in Mexico and then in California where he founded nine of the area's 21 missions. For this he is known as the Father of California's Spanish Missions. While in California, Serra introduced agriculture and irrigation systems even as he converted the Indians to Christianity. He walked or rode for more than 24,000 miles in his missionary work in spite of a leg injury that bothered him constantly. Father Serra died in 1784 at the age of 70 at Mission San Carlos de Borromeo. He was buried under the sanctuary floor. He was canonized by Pope Francis in 2015.

Thursday, July 2: Weekday

Friday, July 3: St. Thomas, Apostle: St. Thomas was called to be one of the twelve Apostles of Jesus. His birth and death dates are unknown. Thomas was a dedicated but impetuous follower of Christ. Though he appears several times by name in the Gospels, he is best known for his role in verifying the Resurrection of Jesus. Thomas' unwillingness to believe that the other Apostles had seen their risen Lord on the first Easter Sunday earned him the title of "doubting Thomas," but upon seeing the resurrected Christ Thomas uttered one of the greatest professions of faith in the divinity of Jesus when he said, "My Lord and My God." Tradition says that Thomas evangelized the Parthians, Medes, and Persians and ultimately reached India. Tradition also says that Thomas was the only witness to the Assumption of Mary into heaven.
