

Novena to the Holy Spirit

To be prayed Friday, May 14 - Saturday, May 22, 2021

The Novena to the Holy Spirit is the oldest of all novenas since it was first made at the direction of Our Lord Himself when He sent His apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost [cf. Acts 1:4]. Addressed to the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the light, strength and love so sorely needed by every Christian.

Act of Consecration to the Holy Spirit (To be recited daily during the Novena)

On my knees before the great multitude of heavenly witnesses, I offer myself, soul and body to You, Eternal Spirit of God. I adore the brightness of Your purity, the unerring keenness of Your justice and the might of Your love. You are the strength and light of my soul. In You I live and move and have my being. I desire never to grieve You by unfaithfulness to grace, and I pray with all my heart to be kept from the smallest sin against You. Mercifully guard my every thought, and grant that I may always watch for Your light and listen to Your voice and follow Your gracious inspirations. I cling to You and give myself to You and ask You, by Your compassion, to watch over me in my weakness. Holding the pierced feet of Jesus and looking at His five wounds, and trusting in His Precious Blood and adoring His opened side and stricken Heart, I implore You, Adorable Spirit, helper of my infirmity, to keep me in Your grace that I may never sin against You. Give me grace, O Holy Spirit, Spirit of the Father and the Son, to say to You always and everywhere, Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening. Amen.

Prayer for the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit (To be recited daily during the Novena)

O Lord Jesus Christ who, before ascending into heaven, promised to send the Holy Spirit to finish Your work in the souls of Your apostles and disciples, grant the same Holy Spirit to me, that He may perfect in my soul the work of Your grace and Your love. Grant me the spirit of Wisdom, that I may despise the perishable things of this world and aspire only after the things that are eternal; the spirit of Understanding, to enlighten my mind with the light of Your divine truth; the spirit of Counsel, that I may ever choose the surest way of pleasing God and gaining heaven; the spirit of Fortitude, that I may bear my cross with You and overcome with courage all the obstacles that oppose my salvation; the spirit of Knowledge, that I may know God and know myself and grow perfect in the science of the saints; the spirit of Piety, that I may find the service of God sweet and amiable; and the spirit of Fear, that I may be filled with a loving reverence towards God and may dread in any way to displease Him. Mark me, dear Lord, with the sign of Your true disciples and animate me in all things with Your Spirit. Amen

FIRST DAY

Holy Spirit! Lord of Light! From Your clear celestial height, Your pure beaming radiance give!

The Holy Spirit

Only one thing is important, eternal salvation. Only one thing, therefore, is to be feared, sin. Sin is the result of ignorance, weakness, and indifference. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Light, of Strength, and of Love. With His sevenfold gifts He enlightens the mind, strengthens the will, and inflames the heart with love of God. To ensure our salvation we ought to invoke the Divine Spirit daily, for The Spirit helps us in our infirmity. We do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us.

Prayer

Almighty and eternal God, You have promised to give us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit and have forgiven all our sins. Send forth from heaven upon us Your sevenfold Spirit, the Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding, the Spirit of Counsel and Fortitude, the Spirit of Knowledge and Piety, and fill us with the Spirit of Holy Fear. Amen

Come, O blessed Spirit of Holy Fear, penetrate my inmost heart, that I may set You, my Lord and God, before my face forever. Help me to shun all things that can offend You, and make me worthy to appear before the pure eyes of Your Divine Majesty in heaven, where You live and reign in the unity of the ever blessed Trinity, world without end. Amen.

Come, O blessed Spirit of Piety, possess my heart. Enkindle therein such a love for God that I may find satisfaction only in His service and for His sake lovingly submit to all legitimate authority. Amen.

The one who perseveres unto the end shall be saved.

Come, O blessed Spirit of Fortitude, uphold my soul in time of trouble and adversity, sustain my efforts after holiness, strengthen my weakness, give me courage against all the assaults of my enemies, that I may never be overcome and separated from Thee, my God and greatest Good. Amen.

Come, O blessed Spirit of Knowledge, and grant that I may perceive the will of the Father. Show me the nothingness of earthly things, that I may realize their vanity and use them only for Thy glory and my own salvation, looking ever beyond them to Thee, and to Thy eternal rewards. Amen.

Come, O Spirit of Understanding, and enlighten our minds, that we may know and believe in all the mysteries of salvation; and may merit at last to see the eternal light in Thy Light; and in the light of glory to have a clear vision of Thee and the Father and the Son. Amen.

Counsel is supernatural common sense, a priceless treasure in the quest of salvation. Above all these things, pray to the Most High, that He may direct Thy way in truth.

Come, O Spirit of Counsel, help and guide me in all my ways that I may always do Thy holy will. Incline my heart to that which is good, turn it away from all that is evil, and direct me by the straight path of Thy commandments to that goal of eternal life for which I long.

Wisdom enlightens the mind to discern and relish things divine, in the appreciation of which earthly joys lose their savor, while the Cross of Christ yields a divine sweetness according to the words of the Savior: Take up Thy cross and follow me, for my yoke is sweet and my burden light.

Prayer

Come, O Spirit of Wisdom, and reveal to my soul the mysteries of heavenly things, their exceeding greatness, power and beauty. Teach me to love them above and beyond all the passing joys and satisfactions of earth. Help me to attain them and possess them forever. Amen.

The Fruits of the Holy Spirit

Sunday: 6th Sunday of Easter; Mothers Day

Monday: : St. Damien de Veuster, Priest: When Joseph de Veuster was born in Belgium in 1840, few people in Europe had any firsthand knowledge of leprosy. By the time he died at the age of 49, people all over the world knew about this disease because of him. Forced to quit school at age 13 to work on the family farm, Joseph eventually entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. When his brother, a priest in the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to the Hawaiian Islands Damien volunteered in his place. In May 1864, two months after arriving in his new mission, Damien was ordained a priest. In 1873, he went to the Hawaiian government’s leper colony on the island of Molokai. Under his guidance changes came to the colony -- the settlement had new houses and a new church, a school and an orphanage. Morale improved considerably. Like the people he had chosen to live with, Damien contracted Hansen’s disease and died of its complications. As requested, he was buried in Hawaii, but in 1936 the Belgian government succeeded in having his body moved to Belgium. Part of Damien’s body was returned to his beloved Hawaii after his beatification in 1995. When Hawaii became a state in 1959, it selected Damien as one of its two representatives in the Statuary Hall at the US Capitol. Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI.

Tuesday: Easter Weekday

Wednesday: Sts. Nereus and Achilleus, Martyrs: St. Pancras, Martyr: Sts. Nereus & Achilleus, Martyrs: Devotion to these two saints goes back to the fourth century. They were praetorian soldiers of the Roman army, became Christians, and were removed to the island of Terracina, where they were martyred. Their bodies were buried in a family vault, later known as the cemetery of Domitilla. Excavations in 1896 resulted in the discovery of their empty tomb in the underground church built by Pope Siricius in 390.

St. Pancras, Martyr: We lack reliable historical information about this young martyr. Legend tells us that Pancras was born at the end of the third century in Phrygia (part of modern Turkey). His parents died when he was very young, and he was brought up by an uncle who lived in the city of Rome. While in Rome, Pancras came to know Jesus and the Christian faith, and both he and his uncle were baptized. He publicly confessed his faith and

was arrested during the persecution of the Emperor Diocletian. For this he was beheaded in 304. He was only 14 years old. This saint is usually associated with England because St. Augustine of Canterbury dedicated his first church to Pancras and his relics were presented as a gift to the king of Northumberland. A district in London is named St. Pancras after him. He is the patron saint of children.

Thursday: Our Lady of Fatima: Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children—Francisco and Jacinta Marto and their cousin Lucia dos Santos—received a series of Marian apparitions at Fatima. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. She gave the children three secrets. The first concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second was a vision of hell. The third secret, revealed in 2000, spoke of a “bishop in white” who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. The feast of Our Lady of Fatima was approved by the local bishop in 1930; it was added to the Church’s worldwide calendar in 2002.

Friday: St. Matthias, Apostle: According to Acts 1:15-26, during the days after the Ascension, Peter and the disciples chose, from among their number to replace Judas, one of the men who had accompanied Jesus for the entirety of the public ministry from the baptism by John until the day on which Christ ascended back to the Father. The chosen man would stand with the other Apostles as a witness to his resurrection. Matthias was selected by lot. He is not mentioned by name anywhere else in the New Testament.

Saturday: St. Isidore: St. Isidore is often known as Isidore the Farmer because when he was barely old enough to wield a hoe he entered the service of a wealthy landowner from Madrid and worked faithfully on his estate for the rest of his life. He married a young woman as simple and upright as himself who also became a saint—Maria de la Cabeza. Isidore was a devout and holy man. He rose early in the morning to go to church and all day, as he farmed, he communed with God. He cared for the poor, and there are accounts of Isidore’s supplying the needy with food in miraculous ways. He died on May 15, 1130, and was declared a saint in 1622. He is the patron saint of farmers.




