Sacred Heart of Jesus School embraces the Year of Faith

When Pope Benedict XVI declared the Year of Faith to run from October 11, 2012, through November 24, 2013, Sacred Heart of Jesus School embraced the concept to renew and strengthen the students and faculty in their practice of faith. School administration turned to the words of Bishop Ricken, Chair of the U.S. Bishops Committee on Evangelization and Cathecesis, to guide them as they attempted to bring the Year of Faith to life: the "purpose of the Year of Faith is to renew and strengthen Catholics in their practice of faith so that they may inspire the world with their example. This is the new Evangelization."

To renew and strengthen Catholics in their practice of faith, SHS embraced the unique history of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, which includes a wealth of religious art, sculptures, carvings and architectural elements. All students in pre-kindergarten through eighth grade enjoyed tours of Sacred Heart Church. The tours were reinforced by various projects in art and computer classes.

"The students were all inspired by the beauty of the church," said SHS art teacher Dorothy Calandro. While all grade levels have produced various types of art based on the church's art and architecture, the fifth through seventh grade students are currently capturing the church art and architecture through photography.

"There are a lot of things in the church that I'd see a million times, but never thought of what they mean," said seventh-grader Claudia Pickell. "Everything in there (the church), even the smallest thing, has a meaning."

Through the church tours, students and faculty connected the art and symbolism in the church to an enhanced sense of worship during the weekly Liturgy celebration. The church tours were so successful that plans are underway for a Spring event, "The Sacred Vessels," according to SHS religion coordinator Marylyn Dietz. "Through 'The Sacred Vessels' students and faculty will hear the unique history of some of Sacred Heart's treasures and understand the purpose of each," said Dietz.

Students will also examine the art, history and symbolism of the paschal candle. Sacred Heart parishioner and archivist Mary Lee Eggart, Jr., creates one-of-a-kind paschal candles each year that are designed to reflect the symbolism in the church.

To inspire the world with their example, SHS had only to turn to the Sisters of St. Joseph, who have blessed the school with their presence since its founding in 1929. SHS initiated a program reflecting the vision of Fr. Jean Pierre Medaille in 1650, founder of the Sisters, "to serve our neighbors with the same loving concern St. Joseph had shown in caring for Jesus and Mary."

SHS's "Dear Neighbor" Program now serves as an umbrella for the school's philanthropic efforts and is based on the concept that neighbors include those physically in our neighborhood as well as those who are neighbors in a broader sense. Food items are collected weekly for the Sacred Heart of Jesus-St. Vincent dePaul Food Pantry and are distributed to those in need who live within the parish boundaries. Each October, the P.E. Department organizes the "Dear Neighbor" Walk for Diabetes, with collections going to the local chapter of JDRF to assist with research for Type 1 diabetes.

Another of the many projects operating under the "Dear Neighbor" umbrella was hled in November, the "Dear Neighbor" Veteran's Day project. Items were collected for Rayen Outreach Center for Homeless Veterans, which is located a few blocks from the school.


