





#### A Message from Fr. Josh Johnson, Pastor

Dear Sacred Heart Family,

Recently our seminarians, Vagabond Missionaries and I were walking through the neighborhood praying the rosary. As we passed by one of the houses, a woman came outside and asked if we could pray with her. She wasn't Catholic, but she shared her heart with us and told us how grateful she is for Sacred Heart Church. She said, "I'm not Catholic, but your church is the only one in this community that really seems to care about all of us who live here. We see your seminarians and missionaries praying in the neighborhood all the time, and every time we've called for help with groceries, y'all have been there. You've welcomed us through the Café and made us feel like we belong."

That conversation has stayed with me. It reminded me that Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish isn't just a set of buildings on Main Street. It's a living witness of God's love in the heart of Mid-City Baton Rouge. The presence of Jesus is visible here through the prayers, the laughter, the service, and the welcome we extend to everyone who crosses our path.

Below you'll find the accounting report of our parish finances for the fiscal year July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025. I see this report as more than a list of numbers but as a testimony of what God can do when His people place their trust in Him.

This summer we opened the Underground Hub, the Dorothy Day Café and the new St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry, and both have already become places where lives are changing. Our Vagabond Missionaries are hosting Bible studies, fellowship nights, and a Becoming Catholic program for our teens. Twelve of our young people are now coming to Mass every Sunday, and four are preparing to enter the Catholic Church. Watching them encounter Jesus and find their place in the Church reminds me why we do what we do. It is all about helping people discover that they are seen, known, and loved by God.

This fall we also opened the Blessed Stanley Rother Seminary House of Formation right here in the rectory. Our seminarians are taking classes at FranU, serving in Sacred Heart School, partnering with Vagabond Missions, praying the rosary in our neighborhood, joining mission trips, and spending a lot of time with Jesus in adoration. Their presence has brought new joy, energy, and holiness to our parish. They are learning how to be priests who love the Eucharist, the poor, and the people of God, and it is a gift to watch them grow.

In August we began our new First Saturday: Mass, Meals, and Mission. Each month we honor the Blessed Mother by offering confessions at 7:30 am, Mass at 8:00 am, adoration and rosary at 8:30 am, coffee and fellowship at 9:00 am, and service to our neighbors from 9:30 to 11:30 am. Together we have picked up litter, stocked the food pantry, made blessing bags and shared them with people at the bus station, cleaned up Sweet Olive Cemetery, and delivered groceries to families who have called us for help. It has been a beautiful way to pray, worship, and serve side by side.

Sacred Heart School also continues to grow in faith and excellence. When I first arrived, we had 185 students. This year, we have 238. Under the leadership of Principal Sharon Jones, the Mercedarian Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament have moved into our renovated convent and are serving in more ways than ever as president, assistant principal, receptionist, campus minister, disciplinarian, and second-grade religion teacher. Their joy and prayerful spirit have brought peace to our hallways and a deeper faith to our children and teachers. And yes, our three therapy dogs have become beloved members of the Sacred Heart family too.

Our Becoming Catholic program has also exploded in growth from three participants my first year to thirty this year. The Holy Spirit is truly moving through our parish, stirring hearts to conversion and drawing people to the sacraments. Every new Catholic reminds me that God is still in the business of changing lives right here in our community.

Every classroom, every renovated space, every new program, every soul being drawn closer to Jesus is a reminder that God is faithful. We are becoming what we have always prayed to be, a parish of worship, prayer, study, fellowship, and service.

Of course, just as your own household feels the strain of rising costs, so does our parish. The costs of ministry, maintenance, and mission continue to rise, but through your generosity we are able to keep going and keep growing. Your tithes, online giving, and sacrificial generosity make all of this possible.

This year, I am excited to share some truly hopeful news. A generous donor has come forward with a commitment to match our parish giving if we can demonstrate consistent growth in our collections up to a total of \$150,000. That means that every gift you give, every increase in offertory, and every new online giver helps us unlock even greater resources for the mission of Jesus here at Sacred Heart. It is a beautiful opportunity to multiply generosity and to see what God can do when we give together in faith.

# A Prayer for Protection in Hurricane Season




